Centenary Development Project

At the last Church Council meeting a number of important decisions were taken which will affect our Church property.

The first decision was to proceed with the sale of the land currently occupied by the Scout Hut and the World War 2 bomb shelter. Having been involved with the Scout Group for many years it is sad that the Group has had to close, but times change and it was agreed by all that it was not possible for the Group to continue. Unfortunately the buildings are not suitable for repurposing and are therefore redundant.

The site will come up for sale by auction on 9 October. Assuming that a sale is achieved, the Circuit has agreed that the sale proceeds can be reinvested back into our premises. To this end, the Church Council has agreed to launch our Centenary Development Project utilising the funds from the sale. It is important that the Project furthers the mission of both our Church and the Circuit so we will focus on the priorities of Youth, Worship and Community by undertaking improvements to enhance our Welcome, our Facilities and our Sustainability.

We are currently working with an architect to help us draw up a list of works. No final decisions on the work have been made, but I anticipate that, as a minimum, we will look to open up the Eastern Avenue entrance, upgrade the kitchens and look at installing solar panels.

This is a really exciting opportunity for our church which will position us ready for our Centenary and beyond.

The Harvest Hymn by Sir John Betjeman


We spray the fields and scatter the poison on the ground, so that no wicked wild flowers upon our farm be found. We like whatever helps us to line our purse with pence;

Diwali is the five-day Festival of Lights, celebrated by millions of Hindus, Sikhs and Jains across the world.

A festival of new beginnings and the triumph of good over evil and light over darkness, and for some also coincides with harvest and new year celebrations.

Diwali this year begins on 1st November but changes each year because it is set by the lunar calendar. The word Diwali comes from the Sanskrit word *deepavali*, meaning "rows of lighted lamps".

Houses, shops and public places are decorated with small oil lamps called diyas. People also enjoy fireworks and sweets too, so it's really popular with children.

Each religion marks different historical events and stories. Hindus celebrate the return of deities Rama and Sita to Ayodhya after their 14-year exile. They also celebrate the day Mother Goddess Durga destroyed a demon called Mahisha.

Sikhs particularly celebrate the release from prison of the sixth guru Hargobind Singh in 1619. But Sikhs celebrated the festival before this date.

In fact, the foundation stone of the Golden Temple at Amritsar, the most holy place in the Sikh world, was laid on Diwali in 1577.

The founder of Jainism is Lord Mahavira. During Diwali, Jains celebrate the moment he reached a state called Moksha (nirvana, or eternal bliss).

Diwali is also a time for prayers and leaving offerings to gods and goddesses - like Lakshmi the Hindu goddess of wealth - for good luck..

We wish our friends a Happy Diwali.

From Me To You Letters

This is a fascinating charity who provide letters for those who are living with cancer.

It was founded in 2017 by two friends. Some time previously one of them became ill and not knowing what to say, she wrote letters to her friend in an attempt to reach out and connect. Their story was featured on the radio and sparking an interest with others, the charity Donate a Letter was formed.

"Our writers, from all over the world, send us their donated letters, which we then distribute to those most in need. We work with our letter outlets - hospitals, cancer centres and partner charities - as well as sending letters directly to people's homes, which anyone can request whenever a boost is needed."

Donate A Letter aims to reduce the social isolation and loneliness so often associated with cancer. Receiving a letter or card, even from someone you don't know, can bring a connection and sense of comfort at a time of difficulty.

NHS BLOOD AND TRANSPLANT SERVICE

BLOOD DONATION

Blood stocks are critically low. The NHS are making an urgent appeal for those eligible to make a lifesaving blood or plasma donation.

September marks Childhood Cancer Awareness month and we want to encourage more donors to switch to platelet donation. This is because 1 donation can help up to 12 children with cancer.

Currently, there are only 10,000 people in England who regularly give platelets and we need 3,500 new platelet donors this year. We need more blood donors with A negative, A positive and AB negative blood types to consider changing to platelet donation.

Platelets are tiny gold-coloured cells in your blood which help it clot and stop bleeding. Most donations help people with cancer who are undergoing chemotherapy to avoid bloodloss, but platelet transfusions also help people who've lost a lot of blood after an accident, organ transplant or surgery.

Why we need more donors of Black heritage

At the moment we need more people of Black heritage to grow the number of blood donors with well-matched blood to help those with sickle cell disorder. In recent years, there has been a rise in demand for some rare blood types that are more common in people of Black heritage, including people of Black-African, Black-Caribbean and Mixed ethnicity.


REDBRIDGE FOOD BANK

ACTION FOR CHILDREN

Because they're a child, like any other. A child with a favourite TV show. A favourite food. A child that deserves to feel safe and loved, in a place they can call home.

That's why we're launching A Place to Call Home, a campaign calling on UK governments to take immediate action on children's social care, so children in care get the high-quality homes, love, and support they need to thrive. A shortage of good, loving homes means that many children have a poor experience of being in care. Not all foster or residential homes provide the high-quality care that a child deserves, or are able to meet that child's individual needs.

Children often have to move home several times as their circumstances change, and are moved to homes far from their families. They can struggle to get the support they need from school, health and other services, and they can feel ignored by professionals when they speak up.

All four UK governments have recognised these problems, carried our reviews, and are starting to act. But they're not moving fast enough to make the vital changes needed to their care systems.
